**Quarter Horse** Height: 14.2–17 hands (4ft 10in–5ft 8in)  
Bred to be very fast, powerful sprinters, these horses excel at short races, such as the quarter-mile. Quarter Horses are ideal for ranching or all-purpose riding, especially western riding contests, rodeos, and trail and pleasure riding.



**Andalusian** Height: 15.1–16.1 hands (5ft 1in–5ft 5in)  
Pure-bred Spanish horses such as the Andalusian have been prized by kings and queens for centuries. Today, this beautiful breed is still known for its nobility and elegance. Andalusians are usually gray or bay, sometimes with spots.



**Paint** Height: 14.2–15.2 hands (4ft 10in–5ft 2in)  
All paint horses have a distinctive splotchy-looking coat. The pattern is often brown and white, but may also include black, gray or tan. Paint horses are strong, hardworking and easy to train, and were popular with farmers and American Indians in the old West.



**Tennessee Walking Horse** Height: 14.3–17 hands (4ft 11in–5ft 8in)  
Other horses can go for a trot—a bumpy kind of jog that's faster than walking—but Tennessee Walking Horses have a smooth, fast "running walk" instead. Riders say that its canter feels like a rocking chair! Tennessee Walking Horses come in all sizes and colors.

**Appaloosa** Height: 14–16 hands (4ft 8in–5ft 4in)  
The Appaloosa is one of the oldest horse breeds on Earth—pictures of horses with the same spotted appearance have been found on ancient cave walls! Appaloosas are bred to work hard, and have an easy-to-please attitude and gentle disposition.



**Thoroughbred** Height: 14.2–17 hands (4ft 10in–5ft 8in)  
With strong legs to withstand the pressure of high speeds, thoroughbreds are known for racing. They are generally courageous and bold. They can also be nervous and excitable, but they respond to kindness. Thoroughbreds are always a solid color.



**Arabian** Height: 14.1–15.1 hands (4ft 9in–5ft 1in)  
Arabian horses compete in a full range of equestrian sports. They have great endurance, are highly intelligent, and are generally friendly, but they can be spirited too. Many Arabians look white, but they are actually a very light gray. (They can also be chestnut, bay or black.)



**Morgan** Height: 14.1–15.2 hands (4ft 9in–5ft 2in)  
Morgans were the first American horses to be registered as a breed, and were once ridden by American soldiers. Many riders today choose Morgans for their agreeable nature, intelligence and athleticism. Morgans make strong racers and good workers.
